DYXnet founder and CEO Lap Man and Tongda Group Holdings chairman and CEO Wang Ya Nam have been named EY Entrepreneurs of the Year for China in the technology category. The annual awards recognized 12 Greater Chinese entrepreneurs, including three from Hong Kong, for their innovative business mindsets and outstanding business achievements. DYXnet is a carrier-neutral network service provider offering multi-protocol label switching virtual private network (MPLS VPN) internet access, data center, unified communications and network security services in Greater China. Tongda Group is a provider of consumer electronics casings.

Competitors were judged based on criteria including entrepreneurial spirit, financial performance, strategic direction, national or global impact, innovation, personal integrity and influence

The winners, which also include Hong Kong headquartered hotel chain operator Ovolo Group founder Girish Jhunjhnuwala, will represent Greater China at the EY World Entrepreneur of the Year (WEOY) awards in Monaco in June 2017. Over 50 national award winners from around the world will compete.
